 - * Using a multilevel mixed-effects and diff-in-diff estimation, this research examines whether China's recent environmental policy (Ecological Environmental Protection Plan) is associated with cleaner air. (Under Review)
- · Belt and Road Initiative, a Bold Development Initiative or China's Latest Economic Statecraft?
 - * Using selectorate theory (Bueno de Mesquita and Smith, 2007) and data collected from China's BRI partners from 2013 to 2020, this study finds that China is more likely to cooperate with countries that have greater levels of corruption and greater levels of autocracies in light of the fact that those countries are cheaper to buy and easier to make policy concessions. - Wired and Riled: Modern Communication Technology on Social Unrest
 - * Using country fixed effects and 3G data from the International Telecommunication Union, the paper examines whether the development of 3G led to social unrest. To account for the endogenous factors, this study primarily examines Latin America.
- · Government and Its Oppositions: Modern Communication Technologies as Whose Weapons?
 - * In this paper, I developed a theoretical argument that governments as strategic actors choose where to cover 3G for the purpose of controlling dissent.
- · Human Rights in the Digital Age: Can MCT be Used to Promote Government Human Rights Practices?
 - * This paper examines whether the development of modern communications technology led to a positive change in government human rights practices.
- China's Response to Modern Communication Technology Development
 - * In this study, I seek to answer three questions: How does MCT affect government human rights practices in general under authoritarian regimes? In what kind of issues is the Chinese government more likely to respond when faced with pressure from MCT? In which type of issue is the government more likely to ignore/censor?
